- 4. **Demonstrate** Scout Spirit
- 5. Proper Equipment/Clothing-
- 6. Attend Information/Training Sessions-
- 7. Participate in a minimum of 2 Overnight Backpack Tripsbetween July 1, 2001 and June 30, 2002

#### **Meal Planning**

Backpacking menus, travel meals (restaurants, picnics, etc.)

#### Trail Master

Collect info. On back-country hiking/camping areas, help tailor groups

#### Communications

Provide information, web site updates (links, info.), help track groups in Park(s)

#### **Travel Agent**

What to see, do in the National Parks, what to do in-route to Parks

#### Lodging

For Groups while in-route, within the Parks, and coordinate info. for family bookings

#### **Out-of-Park Activites**

Ideas: Aerial Tram, River Rafting, Golf, Fishing, Scenic Boating, Scenic drives

#### **Public Relations**

Publicity for Troop- pre and post trip, Collect contact info. For Local Councils, Troops and Military out west
